A Message From Our Director.....

"My dad has COVID," the message read. These words seemed to jump out at me as I read the message from one of our former girls. Jessica had spent most of her teenage years with us. After she left us, she earned a Bachelor of Social Work degree from Marshall University.

I remembered the day she came to us. I thought of the bravery she showed as she testified against a father who had horrifically sexually and physically abused her and her brother. That testimony and subsequent trial had sent this evil man to prison for a number of years. This was the "dad," still in prison, who had COVID. I must have some residual anger towards this man, as the only sorrow I felt was for Jessica.

A year before this, she had asked me if she could list me as her medical power of attorney, ensuring that anyone who had failed to protect her childhood had no control over her life. Mere days after informing me of her father's health, I received another message, telling me her father had died in Mount Olive Correctional Center. Although she already knew how much I loved and cared for her, I told her again and expressed my sorrow for the emotional pain she continued to suffer from this man. Her response will forever remain in my heart. It read: "I'm okay. My battle that started when I was nine, ended with his death. I've been set free and I don't live in the shadow of my past now. I've not only survived but also overcome my past. I made peace with my dad before he died. I just have to say goodbye when I find out where his ashes are

buried. This is my closure. The great people in my life far outweigh the people who hurt me. Without Golden Girl, I wouldn't be as resilient as I am. You gave me a home and a sense of belonging. It was the first place I have ever felt safe."

Jessica has decided to write a book about her childhood. She sent me what she planned to write in her acknowledgements. In part, she wrote, "... Blood is not always thicker than water. That is a fallacy. Family is who truly loves and cares about you and shows it in their actions..." When I think of the terrible sexual, physical, mental and emotional abuse she suffered, I still feel angry. The ones who should have been the first to protect and love her neglected and abused her. They stole her childhood.

I take comfort in the knowledge that Jessica has overcome her past and continues to thrive. When she walked in our doors those many years ago, she became "ours". We promised to protect and love her. We promised to keep her safe. She found her sense of belonging. She found her home.

Last week, at our Derby Brunch, someone asked one of our former girls to describe Golden Girl in one word. Without hesitation, she said, "Family". As each girl comes to us, she becomes, forever, part of our Golden Girl Family. Perhaps Jessica says it best. "Family is who you make it...no matter how hard I fought to push you away, you never gave up on me. Sometimes, that's what counts the most."
