A Message From Our Executive Director...

I've always been a little obsessed about anything Disney. I love the parks, the movies, pixie dust and, of course, the Disney Magic. At Disney World, I loved watching the face of a young girl spotting a Disney Princess on Main Street, USA. The girl would impulsively run to hug the princess, whispering I love you, as her parents attempted to photograph it all. Disney even has a name for this experience. It's called A Magical Moment.

At Golden Girl, we believe that each one of our girls is a princess. As a child of God, they are of royal birth. In our Respect Program, the first phase is Respect Yourself, the color purple, the color of royalty. Most of our girls come to us defeated, scared, feeling unwanted and certainly not worthy enough to be called a Princess. They are so very wrong.

Most of the Disney Princesses suffered difficult childhoods. Cinderella's father died when she was a child. Her evil stepmother mistreated and neglected her. Many of our girls have lost one or both parents to drugs, incarceration or death and have been mistreated and neglected. Snow White cared for seven small men (one even named Grumpy). Our girls have often had to act as the adult in their homes, caring for their younger siblings, while missing the experience of being a child themselves. Rapunzel was kept in a tower, isolated from the world by a manipulative mother figure. For some of our girls, their towers were dilapidated trailers, isolated so others wouldn't see the welts, bruises and burns on their bodies.

The Little Mermaid found her man but couldn't talk to him, watched him almost marry an evil witch in disguise and then saw her dad die (not permanently). She was 16 years old. Can you imagine the trauma? ALL of our girls have experienced some level of trauma.

We believe that each of our princesses deserve the opportunity to receive an excellent education and vocational/on the job training. This is the reason we built the Golden Minds Center for Learning and Development and the Golden Treasures Resale Shop. One of our girls, Taylor, was hired to work in our Shop. Taylor has experienced homelessness and terrible trauma, but now, for the first time in her life, she feels confident about her future. At our ribbon cutting ceremony, several people were asked to speak, including Taylor. She declined, feeling unsure of herself. After the ribbon cutting, Taylor told me that she wished she had spoken. I asked her if she still wanted to. She nodded and I told her I could give her something even better, being on TV. I quickly located a reporter and told him he had the rare opportunity to interview one of our girls, an employee at our Shop. During the interview, Taylor proudly wore her Golden Treasures apron. She spoke of her desire to one day open her own business, that she felt loved and accepted at Golden Girl, adding, "it feels like family." As I watched this, I thought, "now there is a princess!"

After the interview, I told Taylor that she was amazing (she is)! Everything she said was perfect (it was) and I knew she would have success in life (she will). Taylor looked at me briefly, saw that I was sincere, then threw her arms around me, hugging me and whispered, "I love you, Renee." Then I realized it. Right there on Main Street, Ceredo, USA, I had hugged a princess experiencing the joy of A Magical Moment.

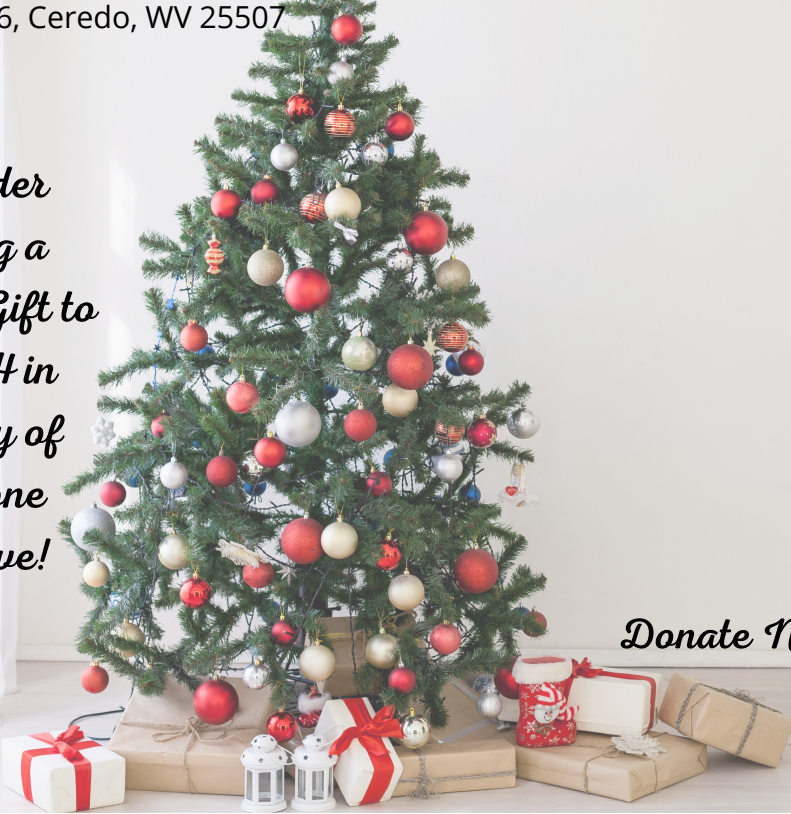

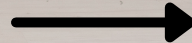
